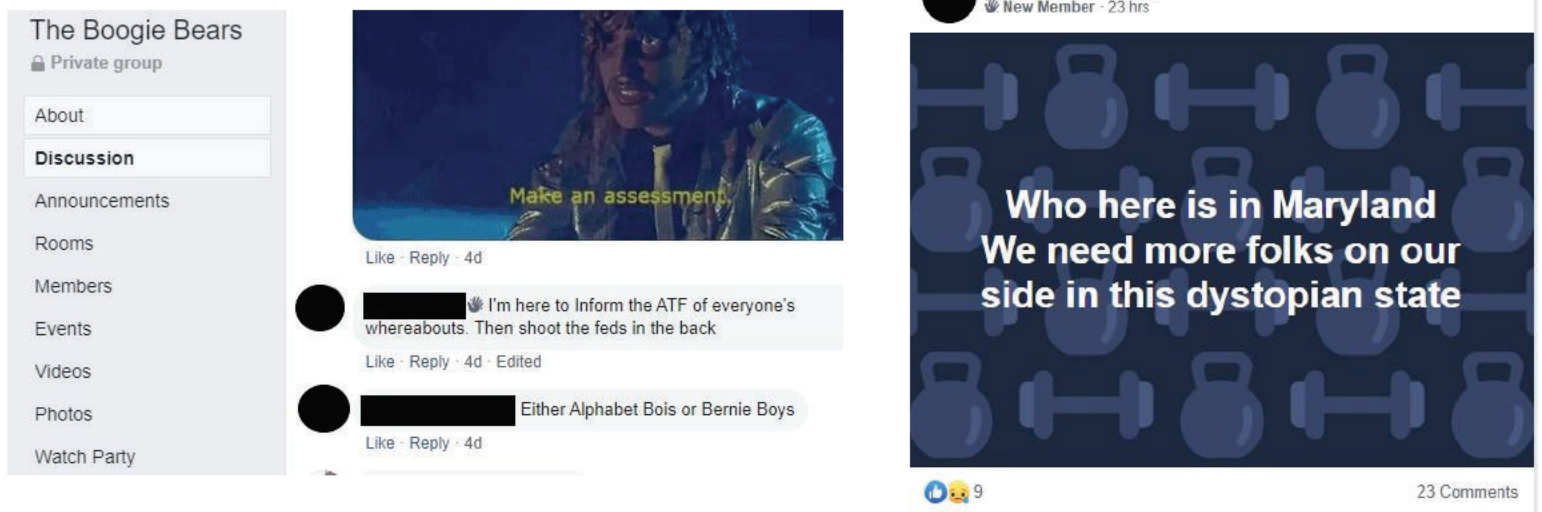




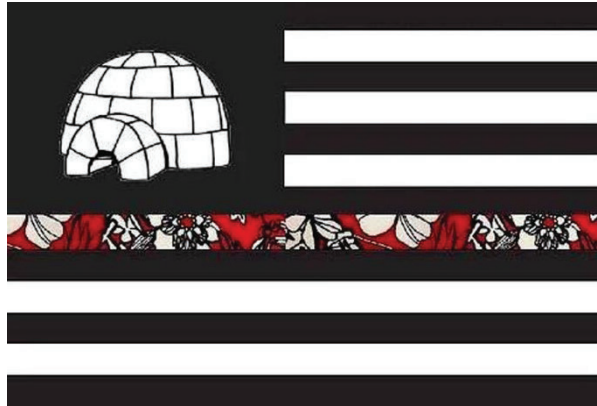

## The “Boogaloo” Movement

ATF-Baltimore, in conjunction with the Baltimore Police Department, has observed social media postings on private social networking sites associated with the “Boogaloo” movement that mention violence against federal and local law enforcement officials. The “Boogaloo” movement consists of individuals that identify with extreme pro second amendment rights, believe a second civil war is imminent, and frequently speak of using violence to overthrow the government. In alignment with their second amendment views, members of this movement are likely to possess multiple types of weapons. It has been observed that some individuals associated with this group may wear clothing that mirrors military style apparel, which can also closely resemble that of a law enforcement uniform.



Individuals associated with, or in support of, the movement may possess a flag similar to the one above. Please note, the igloo and Hawaiian patterns, as seen above, are symbolic indicators associated with the “Boogaloo” movement.

Use caution if coming in contact with any individual(s) whom may identify with the “Boogaloo” movement.
